CAPE MAY'S MANSIONS, MANNERS & MEDICINE





Don't be green with envy on this trolley tour when you see how well the rich lived in the early 1900s in the most elegant part of town. You'll see the broad streets and summer "mansions" of Cape May's east side on this trolley tour – an area marketed as "New Cape May" at the turn of the 20th Century. Today, new beachfront second homeowners have continued the tradition, running the gamut from the mere wealthy to the fabulously rich.

A tour of the Physick Estate today offers a look back at our Victorian past as evidenced by its architecture, decorative arts, customs, and the lives of one Cape May family, the Physicks.

This year's tour is entitled, The Doctor Is In. Dr. Physick's father, also named Emlen, died in his late forties. In his will, he left his son a rather large inheritance. Emlen Sr.'s only stipulation in his will was that he "would prefer that my son Emlen should study medicine."
