As you tour the estate, interact with a member of the Physick Family household from the 1890s and gain insight into their lives during this time.

Embark on a trolley excursion through Cape May's Historic District and discover its rich history with an informative guide. Admire iconic landmarks, quaint gingerbread houses, and stunning examples of Victorian architecture, including the well-known Grand Dames of Cape May.

Following your tours, your group will visit the Carroll Gallery at the Physick Estate which becomes a Christmas wonderland this time of year. It's all about the wonder of Christmas morning with model trains and a Dept. 56 Dickens Village beneath the boughs of a giant tree. Stand under our tree and feel like a kid on Christmas morning!

10:00AM Step on Guide-Cape May Point

Take a scenic journey through West Cape May and reach the very tip of Cape May's peninsula, known as one of the most renowned migratory spots in North America. Upon entering Cape May Point State Park, you'll catch sight of the fully restored Lighthouse, originally built in 1859. Then, make your way to Sunset Beach where you can see the sunken ship, USS Atlantus-part of a collection of twelve concrete ships that ran aground on June 8, 1926, and remains visible today. Take your time exploring the shops, strolling along the beach in search of precious Cape May Diamonds, and capturing stunning photos of the Delaware Bay.



12:00PM Lunch at the Lobster House Restaurant

Enjoy lunch at The Lobster House Restaurant serving the freshest seafood available, often from their fleet of commercial boats. Dine in one of their five unique and picturesque dining rooms overlooking Cape May Harbor.



1:15PM Christmas Traditions Presentation

As you complete your meal, enjoy a Victorian Christmas presentation. The beloved holiday customs we know today have their roots in the Victorian Era, including Christmas trees, cards, and Santa Claus himself. Discover how Prince Albert brought these traditions from Germany to England after marrying Queen Victoria, and how they eventually spread across the Atlantic to America.
