12:15PM-1:45PM Lunch at Anglesea Pub

Located in historic North WIIdwood, NJ, Anglesea Pub offers a fantastic authentic Irish Pub experience. The building originally opened in 1885 as the Germantown Hotel and was once a place where local fishers could enjoy themselves after a long day on the water. The building changed hands to the Bishop family in 1917 and has been known as the Anglesea Pub ever since. Hailing from Ireland, The McMullan brothers have incorporated their heritage into the pub's atmosphere and strive to provide their customers with the most enjoyable experience.



2:15PM-3:45PM Combination Trolley & Physick Estate House Tour

A tour of the Physick Estate today offers a look back at our Victorian past as evidenced by its architecture, decorative arts, customs, and the lives of one particular Cape May family, the Physicks. Emlen Physick Jr., his widowed mother, Frances Ralston, and his maiden aunt Emilie Parmentier moved into their home when it was completed in 1879.

Emlen, who never married, was descended from a famous and wealthy Philadelphia family. His grandfather, Dr. Philip Syng Physick, was considered the father of American surgery and invented numerous surgical procedures and medical instruments that are still in use today.

Your tour also includes a visit through Cape May on board our quaint trolley. Travel through the Historic District as a knowledgeable guide presents entertaining and educational stories about the nation's oldest seashore resort. See the oldest residential street in town, landmark buildings, gingerbread houses, Victorian architectural features, and the Grand Dames of Cape May.

In the late Victorian Period, the topics of temperance and prohibition were widely discussed in Cape May, just as they were in other parts of the country. This immersive program portrays a heated debate between a saloon owner from the community and a member of the Women's Rights Movement, along with other reformists.

10:00AM-11:30AM Village Views Walking Tour (90 minutes)

Travel back in time to the 1800s and immerse yourself in Historic Cold Spring Village, a sprawling 30-acre site featuring restored and preserved buildings. Stroll along the village paths with your guide, who will discuss the history of the buildings and the crafts and trades of a 19th century

2:30PM-4:30PM Free time for Shopping and Sightseeing Downtown Enjoy a midday break and wander through the delightful Washington Street Mall, the beart of Cape May, Explore an array of distinctive boutiques and

Option A: 2:30PM-4:00PM Stories of Cape Island (45 minutes)

Many stories of Cape Island and the surrounding area's economy are in whaling and farming and while new industries have evolved since then, that heritage is celebrated today. Hear how whalers centuries ago eked out a dangerous but lucrative living near Town Bank and how the area's rich farming heritage continues to be a source of tremendous community pride. Learn about the Union Bethel community in 1831 in which Black residents thrived and the diverse community that continues to contribute to the vibrancy of island life today.

Option B: 2:30PM-4:00PM Cape May's Maritime Trolley Tour (45 minutes)

Whaling, wartime, and wild weather. The remarkable maritime history of our seaside town has long defined the Cape May story. Rediscover our most remarkable maritime moments. Learn about people, places, and natural phenomenon that have made an impact and shaped, literally, and figuratively, the Cape May we know today.
