What was that shadow? Was it the undead of Cape May's past wandering their beloved haunts? You might scoff, you might shudder but rest assured: on board a trolley with an experienced guide you will begin to wonder what's beyond when you hear the tales of hauntings unearthed in Cape May by renowned psychic medium and author Craig McManus.



Tattoos: Modern Expression & Ancient Art

For millennia, humans have tattooed their bodies to express their individuality, chronicling loves, losses, beliefs, victories, affiliation, hopes and dreams. The oldest human mummy discovered -5,300 years old-had 60 tattoos, and his contemporaries, from the South-Pacific to the indigenous people of New Jersey, were also inked. Queen Victoria's husband, son, and many of her grandsons and nephews, who were rulers of Europe, were tattooed. There is a long tradition of sailors using tattoos to chrinicle adventures at sea. Tattooing has become increasingly popular in the last 20 years, and today, eight out of 10 Americans believe society is more accepting of people with tattoos. Learn about the range of expression and history of this ancient art form in this Carroll Gallery Exhibit on the grounds of the Emlen Physick Estate.


12:00PM-12:30PM Cold Spring Brewery

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Day Four



Join us for a unique tour of the 1879 Emlen Physick House with Cape May MAC. During the Voices from Beyond Tour, you will have the chance to listen to actual recordings of spirit voices caught by our staff over the past decade. See photos of the Physick family and their employees, as well as apparitions that have been spotted inside the house. Discover the equipment and tools used throughout history for investigating paranormal activity. Who could these eerie voices belong to? What is keeping them tied to the Physick House Museum? Come draw your own conclusions on this tour.

Your group will also take a trolley and head to Cold Spring Presbyterian Cemetery to visit the graves of Dr. Emlen Physick and his loved ones. Along the way and upon your return to the estate, we'll share interesting beliefs about the Spirit world from both past and present perspectives.

12:30PM-2:00PM Lunch at Anglesea Pub

Located in historic North Wildwood, NJ, Anglesea Pub offers a fantastic authentic Irish Pub experience. The building originally opened in 1885 as the Germantown Hotel and was once a place where local fishers could enjoy themselves after a logn day on the water. The building changed hands to the Bishop family in 1917 and has been known as the Alglesea Pub ever since. Hailing from Ireland, The McMullan brothers have incorporated their heritage into the pub's armosphere and stribe to provide their customers with the most enjoyable experience.
