
Day One

10:00AM-12:00PM Dolphin Watch around Cape May (25 person minimum)

See Victorian homes, the Cape May Lighthouse, and many other points of interest as your Captain narrates the tour. Along the way, you will encounter the dolphins which have made this trip famous. 12:30PM-2:00PM Lunch at the Washington Inn

The Washington Inn, constructed in 1846, was inspired by the grand columns of George Washington's Mount Vernon estate, extending up to the third floor. Today, it stands as one of Cape May's top-rated and most beloved fine dining venues.

At the heart of the Washington Inn are its dedication to warm hospitality and superb New American cuisine. Guests can expect not only exquisite dishes but also a friendly atmosphere.





2:30PM-4:30PM Combination Trolley, Physick Estate & Carroll Gallery

Enjoy a guided trolley tour of Cape May's Historic District with a guided tour of the Physick House Museum, providing an in-depth look into Cape May history and architecture. Learn why Cape May is the only National Historic Landmark City in the nation as you appreciate the details of Cape May's unique Victorian streetscapes via trolley.

Take a guided tour of the first and second floors of the 1879 Physick House Museum, for a detailed look at Victorian architecture and the period. Built in 1879, the 18-room mansion is an architectural materpiece built by famed American architect Frank Furness and one of the best examples of Victorian Stick Style architecture in the country.

Carroll Gallery Exhibit-Tattoos: Modern Expression & Ancient Art

For millennia, humans have tattooed their bodies to express their individuality, chronicling loves, losses, beliefs, victories, affiliations, hopes and dreams. The oldest human mummy discovered-5,300 years old- had 60 tattoos, and his contemporaries, from the South Pacific to the idigenous people of New Jersey, were also inked. Queen Victoria's husband, son, and many of her grandsons and nephews, who were rulers of Europe, were tattooed. There is a long tradition of sailors using tattoos to chronicle adventures at sea. Tattooing has become increasingly popular in the last 20 years, and today, eight out of 10 Americans believe society is more accepting of people with tattoos.





5:00PM-7:30PM Dinner and Shopping at the Washington St. Mall

Spend some time dining and shopping at the charming Washington Street Mall, which acts as the town square for Cape May. Explore a range of unique boutiques, shops, upscale restaurants, and bars, and enjoy nearby Rotary Park.


